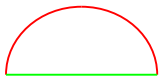
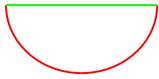

WHEN TO SOW



WHEN TO FLOWER

For best results, sow your seeds in small amounts to get your growing conditions right.

1

Prepare soil clearing weeds and rocks. Rake over the soil

2

Sprinkle seeds on top of the soil, and lightly rake in the seeds

3

Lightly water with a rose watering can to help germinate

4

Label up to make sure you remember what you've planted

5

Keep safe from pests as the first sprouts come through the soil

6

Grow on watering and weeding as the plants grow

Prep for next year

Allow the flowers to self seed or collect up to sow next spring. Clear away the plants ready for new seeds to grow.

Help them grow

- Place sticks over sprouts to protect from wildlife
- Weed out usual garden weeds from the meadow
- Water often as dried out sprouts will die quickly

Garden care

Flower meadows are easily maintained by allowing self seeding and the occasional weeding or thinning to keep the balance.

Pick flowers as needed, cutting the stems at the base of the stem so new flowers can grow back in it's place for more blooms.
